At a regular session of the County Commission in and for the aforesaid County and State, at the Commission Annex, on the 20th day of November, 2025 at 1:30 p.m.

Present: Randolph County Commissioners, Chris See and Chris Siler were present. Randolph County Commission President, David Kesling was absent.

Meeting called to order by Commissioner Siler

PUBLIC COMMENT: None

MINUTES:

Commissioner See moved to approve the minutes from the regular meeting that was held on November 6, 2025, as submitted. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

REPORTS:

North Central Community Corrections Director, Erin Golden appeared before the Commission. She said there are currently 110 participants on the program and the program has saved the County \$649,510.56 in regional jail bills, so far this fiscal year.

911/OEM Director, Mike Miller appeared before the Commission. He reported that the heating is not working in the 911/OEM building and Casto Technical has been working on it. He said there are several things that need to be replaced or repaired but there is no money in his budget to do it. He said he needs the Commission to pay this bill and more to come. He said the two UPS units at the 911 Center still need batteries and one needs a power module that will cost about \$64,000.00. He said the electric went out today at the 911 Center but thankfully the phones still worked. He said if these UPS units are not taken care of the next time they could lose those phone lines. He said Pendleton County is building a new OEM Office and would like to purchase some of Randolph County's 911 consoles that have never been used. He said there are still several pieces of equipment at the 911 Center that will be at the end of life soon and will need to be replaced. He said they need money for that.

Commissioner Siler said they are trying to find the money to get the UPS units maintenance and batteries.

Randolph County Humane Officer, Ron Gooden appeared before the Commission. He gave a report on activity between October 16, 2025 thru November 19, 2025. He said he responded to 32 calls in the County and 22 in the City of Elkins. He said the intake at the shelter was 35 animals. He said 31 animals were seized from one residence from a tip that came in to the Sheriff's Office. He discussed a dog that has been getting loose and causing problems since December 2024. He said the dog is safe at the shelter now but it took a year to get her. He said she will eventually be adopted out to someone.

Nancy Dotson appeared before the Commission. She said National Hospice Month is a necessary thing and they want to help people. She read the proclamation out loud. Commissioner Siler said they have a hard job and he has had to use it in his family and he appreciates all they do. Commissioner See said his daughter worked for hospice for a little while and she liked to help people but it was hard on her.

Commissioner See moved to approve the National Hospice and Palliative Care Month for November 2025 for Randolph County West Virginia, as presented. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF OUR TOWN JULY 4, 2026 CELEBRATION FUNDING REQUEST

Priscilla Gay, Our Town Treasurer appeared before the Commission. She said 2026 will be the 4th year that Our Town, Inc. has been in charge of the fireworks for the July 4th celebration. She said it takes at least \$10,000.00 for a good fireworks show. She said there are rising costs because of inflation and tariffs. She said they will have to purchase at least \$12,000.00 worth to be able to put on a good show. She said if they pay it by December 1st they get a discount. She said they had a really good crowd this year and are expecting an even bigger crowd in 2026. She said it coincides with America's 250th birthday. She said the City of Elkins gave them \$2,500.00 and she is asking the County Commission for \$6,500.00 and Our Town will put in the rest through fundraisers. Commissioner Siler said the Commission has come into some short falls throughout the year with the Hotel/Motel Tax. He said they already have Our Town in the budget for \$5,000.00 and they can't give them any more at this time. He said maybe later they could find more to give but right now they can only give them \$5,000.00. Commissioner See moved to approve the funding request from Our Town, Inc. for the 4th of July 2026 in the amount of \$5,000.00 and that is to be taken out of Hotel/Motel Tax funds. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION FROM SHERIFF'S OFFICE ON STARLINK

Randolph County Deputy Sheriff, Brian Roy appeared before the Commission. He gave the Commission a proposal of cost for Starlink. He said the proposal he gave them was for 20 units. He said Andy Teter used Starlink on a search and rescue they helped with and they could see it all. He said it would really help out the deputies in all of the dead zones in the County. He said Mingo County implemented this and are running APX portables off of it. He said once we purchase it it belongs to us. He said they make portable bags too if they needed to carry it with them such as a train up on a hill where you can't take a cruiser and have to walk to. Sheriff Elbon said they want to purchase 2 of the bags. Sheriff Elbon said he hopes the County has some Opioid money they can use for this. He said it's a safety thing. Commissioner See said the next Opioid meeting is set for December 18, 2025. Commissioner Siler said it's a great idea. He told Sheriff Elbon to put together a proposal with the bags and batteries and everything they need and see how long that price is good for and come back and they will see what they can do. He said communication has always been a problem.

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF RATIFICATION OF DONATION BOXES FOR WOODFORD UNITED METHODIST CHURCH PLACED IN THE COURTHOUSE FACILITIES

Commissioner Siler said the Commission received a letter from Gregory Tingler, Esquire asking permission to set up food boxes at the Courthouse. He read the letter out loud. He said there are 2 boxes set up, one in the main Courthouse and one at the James Cain Annex building. Commissioner See moved to approve the ratification of donation boxes for food, as submitted.
