At a special session of the County Commission held in and for the aforesaid County and State, at the Court House Annex, on the 20th day of May, 2024 at 9:00 a.m.

Present: Randolph County Commission President Chris Siler and Commissioners David Kesling and Chris See

Meeting called to order by Commissioner Siler

Commissioner Siler announced that the purpose of today's meeting is to Canvass the election results from the Primary Election that was held on May 14, 2024.

Commissioner Kesling moved to set the bond amount at \$300.00 if anyone would like to request a recount. All yes – Motion passed unanimously
