MINUTES:

Commissioner Siler moved to approve the minutes from the regular meeting that was held on September 21, 2023, as submitted. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

Rhett Dusenbury from Congressman Mooney's office was present and said they came up with an agreement to advert the government shutdown until November 17th.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Commissioner Kesling announced that the next regular meeting will be on October 19, 2023 at 1:30 p.m. He said the Courthouse and all other buildings will be closed on Friday for the Forest Festival and on Monday for Columbus Day.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/ACTION:

DISCUSSION OF TIMECLOCK/HR/PAYROLL SYSTEM (See attached copy)

Commissioner Kesling said the Commission received a quote from Choice Pay regarding the Timeclock/HR and payroll system. He said he would like to proceed with the HR module where every employee could access their information on it and see balances of annual leave and sick leave. He said the elected officials of each office would have the say so over it. He said the Timeclock can be accessed by phone or by computer at desk. He said they are not looking at doing the payroll part right now but possibly in the future. He said he would like to do away with paper time sheets. He said they are only interested in the HR dashboard and the Timeclock part of this for now. He said Brooke Hinzman has been using the Timeclock for about a year now and it seems to be working fine. He said they would do this office by office, not all at one time. He said they may start with the County Clerk's Office and then once it is all set up and working well move onto adding another office to it and so forth. Commissioner

INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION AND FUNDING REQUEST REGARDING THERAPY DOG AT ELKINS HIGH SCHOOL (See copy attached)

Mark Rosencrance, Site Coordinator for Communities in School, appeared before the Commission. He went over what his job entailed and said students have needs and the site coordinator job is to help with those basic needs. He said they focus a lot on attendance and since COVID it has changed. He said with Tora, the new therapy Dog, they hope it will boost the students desire to come to school to see her. He said someone in the Community told him he should come to the Commission for help with funding to care for Tora. He said they are also doing a facebook page for donations for her care. He said they have already received funding of \$1,000.00 from a local business and he thinks that funding will be on a yearly basis. He said Randolph County is number 15 to get a therapy dog and Kathy Justice wants all counties to have one. Commissioner Kesling asked if Mr. Rosencrance had approached the City of Elkins for funding? Mr. Rosencrance said he did speak to them but has not officially attended a meeting or anything yet. Commissioner Kesling said the Commission will take his request for funding under advisement and let him know.

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF SECOND HALF PAYMENT TO THE BEVERLY HERITAGE CENTER (See copy attached)

Commissioner Kesling said the Commission received a letter from the Beverly Heritage Center requesting the second half of their funding which would be from July to December, 2023. He said this would come out of the Hotel/Motel Tax money and it would be in the amount of \$25,000.00. He said the Commission tries to help them as much as they can. Commissioner Siler moved to approve the payment of \$25,000.00 to the Beverly Heritage Center and that is to be paid out of Hotel/Motel Tax funds. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF FUNDING REQUEST FROM BEVERLY VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT (See copy attached)

Commissioner Siler said he had some fire chiefs approach him about this. He said the Commission has been giving funding out to the fire departments that are coming to them about getting new air packs. He said some of these fire departments have already purchased their air packs and are now wondering if they can get funding for other items they need. He said this request from Beverly Volunteer Fire Department is for 17 new pagers at a cost of \$900.00 each. He said can they use the funding for that instead of the air packs? Commissioner Kesling said they have given other fire departments \$14,900.00 so to be consistent they would give them \$14,900.00 also. He said he wants to be clear that the other fire departments that have already been given the money is not to come back and ask for more. Commissioner Siler moved to approve the funding request from the Beverly Volunteer Fire Department in the amount of \$14,900.00 for new pagers and that is to be taken out of courthouse contractual funds. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF FUNDING REQUEST FROM ELKINS VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT (See copy attached)

Commissioner Siler said this is the same thing as what was just done for Beverly Volunteer Fire Department. He said Elkins Volunteer Fire Department has already replaced their air packs and are needing new pagers. Commissioner Siler moved to approve the funding request from Elkins Volunteer Fire Department in the amount of \$14,900.00 and that is to be taken out of courthouse contractual funds. The Beverly Heritage Center requests \$25,000 from the second half of the hotel/motel tax for the period from July through December 2023. These funds support necessary programming, educational outreach, promotion, and operations for the Beverly Heritage Center as a museum and a tourist visitor center, and support all of its associated heritage attractions and events.

Since we reported to you last we have gone through some major transitions. Our Executive Director, Chris Mielke, left the organization, moving on with a big advance for his career. While we miss his energy and creativity, the organizations and volunteers have stepped up to keep up our activities through this period. We work in close partnership with Elkins Randolph County Tourism who provide direct marketing on behalf of tourism for the county.

Our organizations rely on funding from a variety of sources, including earned income, donations, and multiple grants. The support from Randolph County Commission is a key piece of our operating income, enabling us to offer programs, activities, and events that not only keep our organizations sustainable, but also improve the quality of life in our community.

Dear Commissioners,

I am contacting you on behalf of the Elkins Volunteer Fire Department to submit a funding request. The purpose of the request is to upgrade communications equipment. Our older low band radio system that is utilized for dispatch countywide is quickly becoming antiquated in that we are no longer able to purchase reliable pagers for our members. These devices are critical for notification of emergencies both in our area as well as to our mutual aid partners across the entire county. The new devices we would like to purchase are compatible with the State Interoperable Radio Network (SIRN) and have the capability to receive paging alerts. This feature is also already available at the county 911 center so there is no additional requirement financially to implement immediately.

Our funding request is in the amount of \$14,900. This will allow us to purchase 17 pagers at an approximate cost of \$850 each. Thank you in advance for your consideration.
