At a regular session of the County Commission in and for the aforesaid County and State, at the James F. Cain Court House Annex, on the 18th day of February, 2021 at 1:30 p.m.

Present: Mark Scott, President of the Randolph County Commission and David Kesling and Chris See, Commissioners thereof.

Meeting called to order by Commissioner Scott

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Jennifer Griggs appeared before the Commission. She said she was there to discuss the work grant program and to let the Commission know they opened a downtown learning center at 125 Third Street in Elkins on February 1, 2021. She said this is step one in the goal of bringing a community college annex to Randolph County. She said the other thing she wanted to let the Commission know was that she received the executed grant agreement from the State of WV for the emergency solutions grant which is the homelessness grant that they applied for through the Cares Act funding. This grant covers Randolph, Barbour, Tucker, Webster and Lewis Counties. She said they will be hiring a part time person to help with processing that grant. She said this will allow them to help people with rent and utilities assistance through the end of this calendar year.

MINUTES:

Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the minutes from the regular meeting that was held on February 4, 2021, as submitted.

Erin Golden, Director of North Central Community Corrections, appeared before the Commission. She said there are currently 113 participants on the program and the program has saved the County \$1,302,750.00 in regional jail bills so far this fiscal year.

Rhett Dusenberry from Congressman Alex Mooney's office was present. He said they are always here to help and gave Ms. Golden a letter of support for the grant she is applying for.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Commissioner Scott said a few meetings back the Commission agreed to enter into a contract with Granite Government Solutions. He said they were going to be one point of contact for our phone related systems. He said after talking with them the Commission realized it was going to be a lot more involved than they were told it was going to be. He said the Commission has been in communication with them and decided it is not a good solution for the Commission at this time.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Commissioner Scott announced that the next meeting of the County Commission will be March 4, 2021 at 1:30 p.m.

Commissioner See announced that Harvey Taylor, who came to the Commission meeting a few meetings ago, has found a place to have the food bank truck come to Randolph County. He said it will be at the Elkins High School on March 13, 2021 and Mr. Taylor is looking for volunteers to help give the food out.

INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION FOR RUN FOR IT

Commissioner Scott said the gentleman that was going to come for this presentation could not come because of the bad roads but he is going to call him on the phone. Commissioner Scott called Jeffrey Fellers by phone. Mr. Fellers said the Tucker Community Foundation is planning on having their Run For It event on September 25, 2021 in Davis, WV. He said they are asking for the Commission's support again. He said the Randolph County Commission has supported this program since 2013. He said 15 teams participated last year virtually. He said since 2013 \$208,000.00 has been raised to go back into Randolph County. This money goes to non-profit organizations throughout the County. He said hopefully this year they will be able to do a live event again, instead of virtually. Mr. Fellers asked the Commission for their normal support of \$5,000.00, if possible. Commissioner See said this is a great program and it has helped a lot of non-profit organizations out. Commissioner See moved to approve the funding request from Tucker Community Foundation in the amount of \$5,000.00 and that is to be taken out of Hotel/Motel Tax funds.

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF GRANT APPLICATION AND LETTER OF SUPPORT FOR COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS

Erin Golden, Director of North Central Community Corrections, appeared before the Commission. Ms. Golden said it was time to apply for the Community Corrections grant again. She said she based it on what was given to them last year. She said the total amount requested is \$140,897.00 with a cash match by the County of \$60,384.00. She said the due date is March 3, 2021 and she plans to drive it to Charleston next Friday. Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the grant application and letter of support for the Community Corrections grant, as requested.

Commissioner See said this has been an ongoing problem and no one else will do it. He
said everyone else told them they would have to replace the whole heating system.
Commissioner Kesling moved to approve replacing the two steam radiators in the
Courtroom at a cost of \$12,500.00 through Casto Technical Services.


