REPORTS:

North Central Community Corrections Director, Erin Golden appeared before the Commission. She said there are currently 86 participants on the program and the program has saved the County \$428,942.50 in regional jail bills, so far this fiscal year. (See attached copy)

Randolph County Clerk, Brenda Wiseman reported on the General Election. She said there will be a public test of the voting equipment tomorrow October 21st at 10:00 a.m. in the lobby of the courthouse. She said the public is invited to attend. She said early voting will begin on October 26th and run thru November 5th and it will be held at the Wees Annex and the Russell Memorial Public Library in Mill Creek. She said no campaign material is allowed on courthouse property during Early Voting and at the Mill Creek site it is the 100 foot no electioneering rule. She said on election days the polls will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. and the polling locations are all the same as was used in the primary election. She said on Election Night the results will be read in the Courtroom and the canvass will be held on November 14th here in the meeting room beginning at 9 a.m.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/ACTION:

CONSIDER SIGNING PROCLAMATION FOR FIRST RESPONDERS APPRECIATION DAY (See attached copy)

Commissioner See read the proclamation out loud. This proclamation declares October 28, 2022 as First Responders Appreciation Day in Randolph County. There were several first responders in attendance at the meeting. Sheriff Elbon said he appreciates the Commissions support of the Sheriff's Office. Commissioner Siler moved to approve the Proclamation, as presented. All yes—Motion passed unanimously

RECOGNITION AND RETIREMENT OF K-9 HACKER

Randolph County Sheriff's Deputy Tyler Knotts and K-9 Hacker, appeared before the Commission. Deputy Knotts thanked the Commission for everything they have done for Hacker. He said it has been a difficult couple of months. He said it was very scary when he noticed Hacker was having a problem walking. He took him to a local vet that said it could possibly be a spinal injury and referred him to a vet in Pittsburgh. He said that vet did testing and said it was not something that would require surgery but it would make a permanent change in his back gate. The vet advised to not have Hacker do police work anymore as another injury could cause permanent damage. Deputy Knotts said although Hacker had a short career he did a great job. He helped other agencies when needed and located several pounds of drugs. He said Hacker has been an asset to the Sheriff's Department and to his family. He said this injury won't affect Hackers life and he will keep him at his home. Deputy Knotts said they have gotten another dog, K-9 Twix, and he is still in training. He said they will pro-rate the cost of the new dog and the Sheriff's Office is applying for a grant for the cost of K-9 Twix. Commissioner Siler said he has 25 years of experience working with police dogs and they are put up in front of an officer to protect the officer and they would rather a dog get hurt instead of an officer. Sheriff Elbon said he is thoroughly impressed with the Commission. He said they supported them through all of this and said to get Hacker help when they found out he was injured. Commissioner See read the letter of recognition out loud. Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the retirement of K-9 Hacker from the Randolph County Sheriff's Department. All yes - Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER PROPOSAL TO RELOCATE PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S OFFICE

Randolph County Prosecuting Attorney, Michael Parker, appeared before the Commission. He said for the last 2-3 years he has noted during budget time that he is out of space in his office. He said he has people sharing offices and spaces that were not supposed to be offices being used as offices. He said the new space being discussed would definitely be a significant improvement. He said it is a good opportunity for the County. Commissioner Siler said they definitely need more room. Commissioner Kesling said the building being discussed is the Jory and Smith Law Office located at #1 Randolph Avenue which is right beside the Magistrates Building. There is also a parking lot across the street that goes with it. He said they are looking at a grant to purchase the building. Mr. Parker said he appreciates them looking into it. Commissioner Siler moved to proceed with purchase of #1 Randolph Avenue to house the Prosecuting Attorney's Office. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER SIGNING PROCLAMATION FOR UNITED WAY DAY (See attached copy)

Commissioner See read the proclamation out loud. This proclamation declares Thursday November 1, 2022 United Way Day in Randolph County. Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the proclamation, as presented. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF FUNDING REQUEST FROM UNITED WAY (See attached copy)

Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the funding request from Tygart Valley United Way in the amount of \$1,000.00 and that is to be taken out of courthouse contractual funds. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF FUNDING REQUEST FROM THE TOWN OF HARMAN

Roger Roy appeared before the Commission representing the Town of Harman. He said they are having problems with their water system and other things and don't have money to pay the bills. Commissioner Kesling said they have to come to the Commission for help and discussed the letter that was sent with all the issues they are having. He said they are asking for \$85,046.13. Commissioner Siler moved to approve the funding request from the Town of Harman in the amount of \$85,046.13 and that is to be taken out of courthouse contractual funds. All yes—Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF PAYMENT FOR POOL/SPLASH PAD PROJECT

Commissioner Kesling said at the last monthly meeting Danhill Construction submitted a bill for \$450,976.14. He said they have done a lot of work such as the deck of the pool, aluminum gutters and some of the splash pad fixtures. He said weather has caused some issues and now the date they want to open the pool is April 28th. Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the payment to DanHill Construction in the amount of \$450,976.14 and that is to be taken out of community development funds. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF CHANGE ORDERS FROM POOL/SPLASH PAD PROJECT (See attached copy)

Commissioner Kesling said there are 7 change orders that need to be done regarding the pool/splash pad project. He said the bathhouse needs a new door and they are going to go with a roll up door. He said it needs a new back door also. He said they need a pool surge shut off valve installed and some electrical upgrades done. The total amount of these change orders are \$21,893.09. Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the 7 change orders as submitted and that is to paid out of community development funds. All yes — Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF ADA CHANGES FOR BATHHOUSE

Commissioner Kesling said there are some ADA changes needed for the bathhouse at the pool. He said 199 people can be at the pool but the current bathhouse doesn't accommodate for that. He said they need all new fixtures and hand dryers. He said this will cost an additional \$124,000.00. He said they are

looking for grant money to pay for it. Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the ADA changes to the bathhouse at the pool but it is not to exceed \$124,000.00. All yes — Motion passed unanimously


